WHAT HAPPENED?

On Tuesday 25 June 2019 we gathered in the Uraidla Football Club to plan what's next for Imagine Uraidla (IU) and our district.

We were not sure what to expect and how many people might come, would it be 20 or would it be more... 84 of us warmed the room and filled it to the brim with ideas.

Before everyone arrived we briefed our table facilitators. Each table facilitator represented a local community organisation or group.

The evening started with a welcome by our volunteer facilitator Steve Dangerfield. Mellissa Bradley (IU Chair) stepped us back in time from when Imagine Uraidla first started and thanked businesses for how much they have done to help the main street. Ben Hopkins motivated us and fuelled the energy in the room with what we were here to do: create a thriving community.

Our evening unfolded rapidly. With no agenda set it was up to attendees to develop what they wanted to focus on. Each of the seven tables were tasked to come up with their top three themes. These were to be high level themes not the nitty gritty ideas. After a long list of themes (the blue notes) we narrowed them down or grouped them into eight categories .

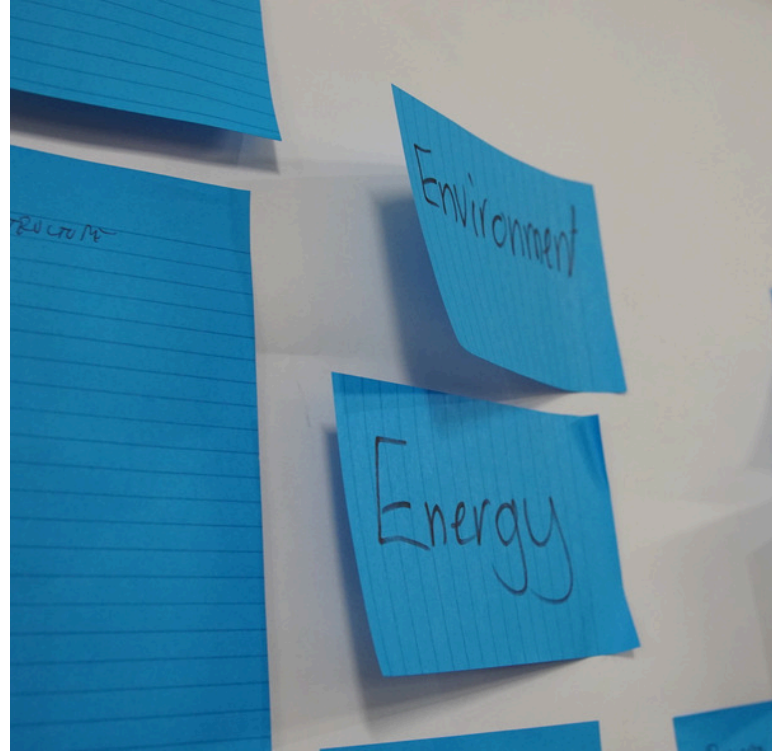

The themes were:

1. Community engagement
2. Culture and arts
3. Environment
4. Infrastructure
5. Marketing and funding
6. Recreation and sport
7. Transport
8. Tourism / events / children

With our list in hand each table got a theme (one table got two) and we set to work.

Table facilitators introduced themselves and then their group had five minutes to brainstorm as many ideas under the theme they were given. After a loud whistle everyone got up and moved tables to a new theme. After five moves we took a breather.







PRIORITISING

Before breaking for supper everyone received three voting dots. The dots were used to help prioritise what ideas were going to progress.

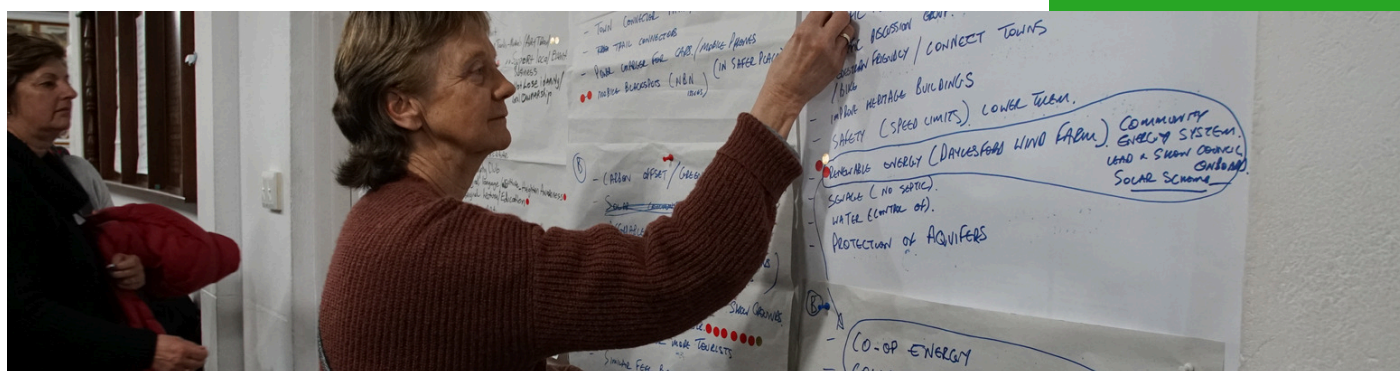
Participants chatted eagerly and studied the butchers paper filled with ideas on the walls the around the room. 219 votes were cast.

After supper and much connecting we took our seats and waited eagerly for the results from the dot voting. Top voted ideas won prizes.

The priority list shows those ideas which received the top five number of 'votes'. Some ideas received the same number of votes and have been categorised accordingly.

The last task was to assign names to ideas, so we could see them come to life.

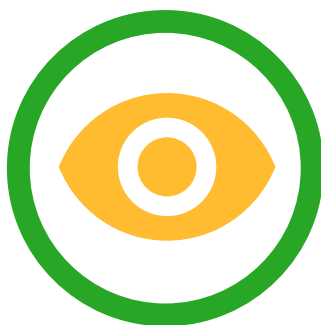
